

Who Are We?

Camden County Partnership for Children (CCPFC) is a non-profit organization dedicated to assisting children with emotional needs, behavioral challenges and/or Developmental Disabilities. Camden County Partnership for Children is the Care Management Organization (CMO) for Camden County.

CCPFC is driven by the WRAPAROUND philosophy. Within the WRAPAROUND framework, individualized teams, called Child and Family Teams (CFTs), are built around the child and family. The CFTs design, implement and manage Individual Service Plans (ISPs) that are specific to the child's individual strengths and complex needs.

To partner with children, families, and communities to provide an integrated, strength-based, comprehensive, accessible, and accountable system of care management for children with emotional, developmental, and behavioral challenges and their families throughout Camden County.

The Process

CCPFC is a contracted agent of New Jersey's Children System of Care (CSOC). As a result, all referrals to CCPFC must go through the contracted system administrator / PerformCare. To make a referral to CCPFC services, please call PerformCare at 877-652-7624.

Once a youth is referred to CCPFC, we immediately contact the family and begin the WRAPAROUND process. Using a Child and Family Team approach, CCPFC works with the family to develop an Individual Service Plan (ISP) that identifies strengths, needs, and strategies to meet the identified challenges. CCPFC then assists the family to identify the community agencies or individuals that provide the needed services and guides the family in accessing them. CCPFC then monitors the progress of the child to ensure that services are being delivered at the highest quality standards and that the needs identified by the family are being met.

The New Jersey Children's System of Care covers all 21 counties with 15 Care Management Organizations operating within a single county or across a region covering multiple counties. Each local system is comprised of the same elements:

Key Players in the System of Care

Contract System Administrator (CSA) / PerformCare

PerformCare is the single point of access to obtain any behavioral health, substance abuse and developmental disability services available publicly throughout New Jersey for youth ages 5 - 21. Call PerformCare at 1-877-652-7624 to access services, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Referrals must be made by phone through the youth's parent or legal guardian. PerformCare will conduct an assessment and link the youth and family with the services they need in the most appropriate setting such as care management, outpatient services or mobile response stabilization services. Services are available to the family in a cost effective manner and without regard to income level, insurance status, languages spoken, or involvement with other systems.

Care Management Organization (CMO)

The CMO provides care management services for youth and families with complex needs. Camden County Partnership for Children is the CMO for Camden County.

Family Support Organization (FSO)

Employs **Family Support Partners** with parental/caregiver experience dealing with children who have emotional or behavioral challenges. All families enrolled in Camden County Partnership for Children are offered an FSO Parent Partner to provide peer support, education, and advocacy to ensure families can obtain appropriate services.

WRAPAROUND

Our Guiding Principles

Family Voice and Choice. Planning is grounded in family member' perspective, and the team strives to provide options and choices such that the plan reflects family values and preferences

Team Based. Working together to reach treatment goals. Team members consist of informal, formal and community supports

Natural Supports. The team actively seeks out and encourages participation of team members drawn from family members' networks of interpersonal and community relationships.

Collaboration. The team members work cooperatively to share responsibility for developing, implementing, monitoring, and evaluating a single WRAPAROUND plan.

Community-Based. The WRAPAROUND team implements services and support strategies that take place in the most inclusive and least restrictive settings possible; and that safely promote child and family integration into home and community life.

Culturally Competent. Respect for and builds on the values, preferences, beliefs, culture, and identity of the child/youth and family, and their community.

Individualized. A customized set of strategies, supports and services tailored to each and every individual family.

Strengths Based. The WRAPAROUND process and the plan build on, and enhance the capabilities, knowledge, skills, and assets of the child and family, their community, and other team members.

Persistence. Despite challenges, the team persists in working towards the goals included in the wrap-around plan until the team reaches agreement that a formal WRAPAROUND process is no longer required.

Outcome Based. Goals are tied to strategies that are measurable indicators of success, monitors progress in terms of these indicators, and revises the plan accordingly.



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
